## Thousands raised from Vegas zip-wire challenge

A BRAVE Messingham lady zip wired 40-miles per hour across Las Vegas to raise funds for Lindsey Lodge Hospice, thanking them for the care her husband received.

So far Sue Oates (pictured left) has raised nearly £3,000 for the hospice in Scunthorpe on Burringham Road in memory of her beloved husband Mick Oates who passed away from cancer at the hospice.

Sue is extremely scared of heights so completing the 12 storey high zip wire was a real challenge, however she had the support from 14 other participating friends from the Rod Stewart fan club that she's part of.

It's the fourth time Sue's been to Las Vegas to see the singer she's been following for almost 40 years in action.

Sue said: "I wanted to

raise much-needed funds to thank the hospice for looking after Mick so well and my friend suggested the zip wire.

"The care the hospice gave him was wonderful and I, and my sons Ryan and Matt, miss him so much."

"I initially said 'no way' to the challenge as I don't like heights or even

extreme rides, but then I thought it would be a good achievement to complete!"

"I'm amazed at how much I've raised as I thought it would be around £500."

The Slotzilla zip line is an inspired slot machine and it sees people zipping along the length of Fremont Street.

"It was so scary flying

along the length of the street but it had amazing views above all the hotels - I'm proud I did it," added Sue.

"My son Ryan is following suit by taking on a cycling challenge in aid of the hospice from Scunthorpe to Wembley in July. We will continue to support Lindsey Lodge all we can."

Lindsey Lodge Hospice is part of a national group called Hospice UK and the fan club Sue is part of recently raised a massive £12,000 from a big weekend event. Part of these funds will go towards the Scunthorpe hospice.

"Dubble Bubble is all about having fun so get your silly outfits ready such as tutus, wigs and over-sized sunglasses. You name it, we want you wearing it!"

But that's not all for this unique event... there will be zorb balls, a barbeque, bouncy castles, magic balloon modelling and a DJ.

Andrew said: "There will be plenty going on for everyone of all ages. We think the zorb balls will be a hit and plus we are planning some extra surprises on the day!"

"We want everyone to have a fantastic time with all the family and help raise funds for the hospice on Burringham Road in

Scunthorpe which cares for local people with life-limiting illnesses.

"We are so thankful for the support we receive from the public because it costs over £400 a day for an in-patient to receive specialised care, £1,200 a month for life-saving oxygen and £5 for a patient's meal."

Dubble Bubble is on Sunday, 24th July from 2pm-6pm at North Lindsey College in Scunthorpe. Tickets cost £20 for adults 16 and upwards, £5 for children 5-15 years, and under 5s are free. A family of four ticket is a discounted price of £35.
